1) Approvals

3) Executive Director's Report

a) Annual Meeting Mingle Update – Jim Salengo advocated for switching the Building Block Awards to the Annual Meeting, since the Building Block Party is primarily a social event and it is difficult to properly honor the recipients. Awards would be changed to the Downtown Partnership Awards and would honor those who have worked closely with us over the past year. This year, Ray & Jeff Legere are strong nominees for their help with the Hometown Heroes Banner ceremony at the Armory and storage of our flower baskets. Also, the Jay Street Business Association has come together to bring more activity and awareness to the street. Heather Peterson suggested that all board members attend the meeting and try to bring someone not familiar with the DSIC. Jim also reminded board members that they needed to nominate a slate of officers to be voted on and announced at the Annual Meeting Mingle.

Carmel Patrick made a motion to move the Building Block Awards to the Annual Meeting Mingle, rename them the Downtown Partnership Awards and honor Ray & Jeff Legere and the Jay Street Business Association for 2016. All in favor.

- b) City Living Tour & HOMES Fair We set up a table outside on Jay Street with about 15 other vendors from the HOMES Fair on June 26. For a first time event, it went very well. We had 75+ people come through to tour downtown residential spaces. Jeff Morlang from Maddalone Assoc. was very pleased with the turnout and the people that visited. We also received a nice thank you from the people at One 11 Liberty Street. The Times Union has contacted Jim about a follow-up article on downtown residential.
- c) Hometown Heroes Banners The opening ceremony on June 1 went very well. For the second round, we have 18 additional banners to go up after July 4, for a total of 45 banners.

d) Downtown Events/Promotions

- i. Schenectady Smiles Photo Contest Schenectady Smiles is having a public photo contest through the Daily Gazette with photos submitted in various categories. There will be a Pep Rally at City Hall in August to wrap up the contest and announce winners.
- **ii.** Schenectady County SummerNight The event is July 15, 5-10pm. For the first time there will be a nationally known headliner, the Gin Blossoms. It should be a very busy night for downtown.
- iii. Canal Fest As part of Canal Fest this year, there will 650 bicycle riders from the Cycle the Erie tour that will come through Schenectady. A bike lane is being added on Washington Avenue to make it easier for them to travel. Schenectady County, Upper Union Street and the DSIC are working together to get information to the bikers to promote what is happening in Schenectady while they are here.
